<p>What is the cost to attend a Professional Learning event?</p>	<p>\$15 for Administrative Academies (SELA) Non-district attendees - varies by event NSSEO employees, Member District employees, and parents/caregivers of students in our member districts are waived in most cases. The cost for a non member district participant will be posted on the registration page. The cost is based upon the length of the course, half-day, full day or series.</p>

How do I know if my event is canceled?	<p>If an event is postponed or canceled, you will receive an email from nsseo@learningstream.com</p>
Can I pay online for my event?	<p>Yes, you can pay online by going to https://nsseo.revtrak.net/An invoice will be sent via email to the email provided during registration after the event. The email will come from kkrafton@nsseo.org</p>
What if I can't make an event I am signed up for?	<p>You may cancel one week prior to an event by emailing kkrafton@nsseo.org.</p>
I was supposed to attend an event that was canceled, will it be rescheduled?	<p>We make every attempt to reschedule the class based on the instructor and location availability. At the time of cancellation, you will receive information regarding future events. NSSEO reserves the right to cancel any workshop due to low enrollment.</p>
When will my district receive a bill for the event that I attended?	<p>All fees will be billed directly to the school district that employs the participant after the event is complete.</p>
What are PD hours? What are CEUs?	<p>Professional Development (PD) hours and Continuing Education Units (CEUs) are credits that are awarded to you for attending a course or a series of courses. These credits are needed in order to renew your educational license.</p>
How do I earn PD hours? CEUs?	<p>To earn PDs/CEUs, you must sign in at the beginning of the day and out at the end of the day. You are expected to attend the entire session to earn credit. All participants must complete an evaluation of the class within two weeks of the session to be sent a certificate.</p>
When do I receive my PDs or CEUs?	<p>You will receive your PDs/CEUs after you have completed the evaluation form. A certificate will be sent to your email.</p>

Where can I find them?</p>	<p>With the Learning Streams system, you can now log into your portal and view your Professional Learning history under "Continuing Education. To log into your portal, click here. To view your past certificates click on "View Certificate PDF". Please note - this new system will only have Professional Learning history from August 2019 to now. If you are looking for Professional Learning history from previous years please email kkrafton@nsseo.org.</p>
<p>SLP (Speech-Language Pathologists): Do I have to earn ASHA CEU's to maintain ASHA certification? (This question and answer come from the ASHA website).</p>	<p>Do I have to earn ASHA CEUs to maintain my ASHA certification? No. ASHA CEUs are just one way that you can meet the professional development requirement for certification maintenance. You may also use any acceptable professional development activities that are not registered for ASHA CEUs, such as employer-sponsored in-service training programs/NSSEO CEUs through the IDFPR fulfill this requirement other professional organizations' continuing education activities college or university course work from an institution that holds regional accreditation or its equivalent courses offered by any provider authorized by the International Association for Continuing Education and Training (IACET)</p>
